

A.G. RHODES | Health & Rehab

History

A.G. Rhodes was one of the first nursing organizations to be licensed in Georgia and is currently one of a few nonprofit nursing organizations in the state. The first of the organization's three locations was constructed in 1904 thanks to the generous donation of land and funds from a prominent Atlanta businessman and community leader, Amos Giles Rhodes. Today, the fifth generation of the A.G. Rhodes family serves on our Boards of Trustees and Advisors. Throughout the years, the organization has adapted extremely well to the times while remaining true to its roots as a family-oriented operation that serves the larger community.



1875

Amos Giles Rhodes comes to Atlanta while laying crossties for the L&N Railroad.



1897

The Hospital of the Atlanta Circle of the King's Daughters and Sons is founded on Church Street (now Carnegie Way).

1879

A.G. Rhodes founds a small furniture company, which later became the famous retail company, Rhodes Furniture.

1900

Hospital officials ask Mr. Rhodes for funding to make repairs but instead he provides land and funding needed for a new building and location.



1930

In conjunction with a major renovation, The Home was renamed after Mr. Rhodes.

1928

Mr. Rhodes passes away, leaving a substantial endowment to The Home.

1911

The Hospital's name is changed to The Home for Incurables Association.



1904

Construction is complete for the Hospital's new location at the corner Boulevard and Woodward, today's flagship location.



1974

Modernization of A.G. Rhodes.



1992

A.G. Rhodes' Cobb County location opens.



1997

A.G. Rhodes expands to include its Wesley Wood location.

2010

The organization changes its name from The A.G. Rhodes Homes to A.G. Rhodes Health & Rehab, and Atlanta is renovated to include a state-of-the-art therapy gym.



2015

A.G. Rhodes serves 1,200 annually and continues setting the standard in high quality senior care.

2014

A.G. Rhodes begins offering horticultural therapy and music therapy within its rehabilitation and therapy department. Also in 2014, the Board of Managers changes its name to Board of Advisors.

2012

The Board of Trustees changes the management responsibilities of the organization by creating a nonprofit company to oversee the already established, nonprofit homes.

2011

A.G. Rhodes continues to expand its sub-acute and rehabilitation services at its Cobb and Wesley Woods locations.
